Possible changes to cemetery policy regarding use of vaults and liners.

Definitions:

Liner: A burial liner is similar to a burial vault, but does not have a bottom.

Vault: A burial vault encloses a coffin on all four sides, the top, and the bottom. Modern burial vaults may be lowered into the grave, and the coffin lowered into the vault followed by the vault lid, which is then sealed to the rest of the vault. Or, the bottom section is lowered, the casket placed on top of it, then the rest of the vault attached to the bottom section and sealed.

X. General Operations

A. Interment

viii. Use of a vault or liner

1. Every casket/coffin (excluding those used in the natural burial section) shall be covered with a vault or liner made of concrete, metal or approved plastic. No wooden or other easily compostable material may be used.

X. General Operations

A. Interment

ix. Casket/Coffin Required

1. Except in the natural burial section, all full-body remains must be contained within a casket or coffin, which must be enclosed in either a liner or vault.

X. General Operations

A. Interment

ix. Casket/Coffin Requirement

1. Full-body burials may include a casket or coffin, but neither is required in any section of Lone Public Cemetery.
2. All full-body burials must include a liner or vault, regardless of whether or not a casket or coffin is used.

X. General Operations

A. Interment

ix. Casket/Coffin Requirement

1. Full-body burials may include a casket or coffin, but neither is required in any section of Lone Public Cemetery.
2. Except in the natural burial section, every full-body burial not utilizing a casket or coffin must use a burial vault, not a liner, thus enclosing the body of the deceased in a confined space.

Section 8113.5 (a) Except with the express written permission of the person entitled to control the disposition of the remains, or in the case of a double burial consented to by both parties, no person shall knowingly or willfully inter the remains of more than one body in a single plot, or place a casket or other human remains in an already occupied grave. (b) Violation of subdivision (a) is a crime punishable as follows: (1) A first offense, or a second offense not committed within a year of the first, is punishable as a misdemeanor by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year. (2) A second offense committed within a year of the first offense is punishable as a misdemeanor or a felony by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year, or pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code. (3) A third or subsequent offense shall be punishable as a felony by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code.

Section 8115 The governing body of any city or county, in the exercise of its police power, may by ordinance prescribe such standards governing burial, inurnment, and entombment and such standards of maintenance for cemeteries, including mausoleums and columbariums, as it shall determine to be reasonably necessary to protect the public health or safety, assure decent and respectful treatment of human remains, or prevent offensive deterioration of cemetery grounds, structures, and places of interment. Such standards may be made applicable to every public and private cemetery within the city or county. Nothing in this section supersedes any provision of this division or Division 7 (commencing with Section 7000) or authorizes the adoption of local standards in conflict with such provisions, except that city or county ordinances adopted pursuant to this section shall prevail over th

Section 8118 A cemetery supplied with disinfected tertiary treated recycled water that installs a hose bib in an area subject to access by the general public shall post signage and labeling 28 | Page PUBLIC CEMETERY DISTRICTS - LAWS & REGULATIONS visible to the general public that the water is nonpotable. The signage and labeling shall be regularly inspected by the water purveyor, as defined in Section 5

Section 8628 An affidavit by any person having knowledge of the facts setting forth the fact of the death of one joint tenant and establishing the identity of the surviving joint tenants named in the deed to any plot, when filed with the cemetery authority operating the cemetery in which the plot is located, is complete authorization to the cemetery authority to permit the use of the unoccupied portion of the plot in accordance with the directions of the surviving joint tenants or their successors in interest. Section 8629 When there are several owners of a plot, or of rights of interment in it, they may designate one or more persons to represent the plot and file written notice of designation with the cemetery authority. In the absence of such notice or of written objection to its so doing, the cemetery authority is not liable to any owner for interring or permitting an interment in the plot upon the request or direction of any coowner of the plot.

Section 8738 An endowment care cemetery is one which has deposited in its endowment care fund the minimum amounts heretofore required by law and shall hereafter have deposited in its endowment care fund at the time of or not later than completion of the initial sale not less than the following amounts for plots sold or disposed of: (a) Four dollars and fifty cents (\$4.50) a square foot for each grave. (b) Seventy dollars (\$70) for each niche. (c) Two hundred twenty dollars (\$220) for each crypt; provided, however, that for companion crypts, there shall be deposited two hundred twenty dollars (\$220) for the first crypt and one hundred ten dollars (\$110) for each additional crypt. (d) Seventy dollars (\$70) for the cremated remains of each deceased person scattered in the cemetery at a garden or designated open area that is not an interment site subject to subdivision (a).

Section 9023 (a) The initial board of trustees of a district formed on or after January 1, 2004, shall be determined pursuant to this section. (b) The persons appointed to the initial board of trustees shall meet on the first Monday after 45 days after the effective date of the formation of the district. (c) At the first meeting of the initial board of trustees, the trustees shall classify themselves by lot into two classes, as nearly equal as possible. The term of office of the class having the greater number shall expire at noon on the first Monday in January that is closest to the fourth year from the appointments made pursuant to Section 9021. The term of office of the

class having the lesser number shall expire at noon on the first Monday in January that is closest to the second year from the appointments made pursuant to Section 9021. Section 9024 (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b) of this section, subdivision (c) of Section 9023, and subdivision (d) of Section 9026, the term of office for a member of the board of trustees shall be for a term of four years and until the appointment and qualification of the successor. Terms of office commence at noon on the first Monday in January. (b) For districts formed before January 1, 2004, where the members of the board of trustees are not serving staggered terms, the board of supervisors shall stagger the terms of the trustees and to accomplish this purpose shall appoint trustees, on or after January 1, 2004, for terms of less than four years. However, a board of supervisors shall not reduce the term of office of a trustee once the trustee has been appointed to that term, whether the appointment was made before, on, or after January 1, 2004. (c) Any vacancy in the office of a member appointed to a board of trustees shall be filled promptly pursuant to Section 1779 of the Government Code. Any person appointed to fill a vacant office shall fill the balance of the unexpired term.

Campbell County Cemetery District (Wyoming)

11. Up to three sets of remains may be contained in a single, adult burial space. Combinations are limited to the following: 2 caskets/vaults, one cremains. 3 sets of Page 8 cremains. One casket/vault, 2 cremains. Other plots (infant, fetus, cremains) are limited to one set of remains/cremains. 12. Stacked Burials. Stacked burials are permitted in certain parts of the cemetery, and are subject to the District Superintendent's approval, based on soil conditions in the cemetery. It is a requirement of the District that the first interment in a stacked burial be made in a concrete vault or concrete liner.

Fetal Demise It shall be the policy of the Campbell County Cemetery District to provide burial plots and conduct burial services at no charge for any non-live birth fetal demise in accordance with the following guidelines and rules. The cemetery district shall make available non-deeded plots in Block 46 located within Mt. Pisgah at no charge. In other cemeteries located within the district, the cemetery staff shall choose an appropriate lot. Lots in Block 46 in Mt. Pisgah, as well as other district cemeteries will be used sequentially starting with the next available plot. A fetal demise of less than 20 weeks gestation, AND NOT requiring a death certificate shall be accompanied with the proper release form from a hospital. This form will serve in lieu of a Burial Transit Permit. A fetal demise with a gestation of greater than 20 weeks, AND requiring a death certificate, shall be accompanied with a Wyoming or other state issued Burial Transit Permit. All fetal demises shall be contained in an appropriate container that prevents the loss of bodily fluids. Fetal remains provided to the district for burial from Campbell County Health or other approved health care organizations shall be accompanied by a signed Chain of Custody Body Release Form signed by both Cemetery and Hospital personnel. Fetal remains released to the district from Campbell County Health will be entered into record only by the unique identifying number issued by the hospital. No patient, parent or family information will be shared with the Cemetery district. The district shall provide a temporary marker with a name or number poured in a concrete base for all fetal demises marking their location of burial. A family may choose to purchase a monument of their choosing at their own expense in accordance with current monument policies of the district.

E. Vaults Vaults are required for all burials and must be made of concrete or metal. Exceptions may be noted for infants and cremains. Infant vaults must be made of concrete or fiberglass approved by the cemetery superintendent. Cremains must be placed in a container specifically approved for their content by the cemetery superintendent. Wooden vaults are not permitted.

Temecula (CA)

INTERMENTS 1. All graves will be dug to a depth, which allows a minimum of 18 inches of dirt to be placed on top of all vaults or liners or cremated remains container. All single adult graves shall be dug to a depth of five feet at the center. The lower tier of a dual interment shall be dug to a depth of seven feet at the center. Infant burials shall be dug to a depth of forty-eight inches at the center. Cremation sties shall be dug to a minimum depth of thirty inches. 2. A minimum container of cloth covered wood casket with handles is required

for all interments except for cremated remains. 3. A durable container is required for all cremated remains interments. 4. Standard vaults must be used for all interments except for cremated remains. 5. A maximum of two cremated remains may be placed in an in-ground cremation site if applicable. Cremated remains vaults are not required. 6. A maximum of two cremated remains may be placed in a cremation niche, within the wall. 7. A maximum of six cremated remains may be placed in an adult size grave. 8. With the exception of pre-installed vaults, a maximum of one cremated remains may be placed in an adult sized grave which is being used or is intended to be used for one full casket burial.

Traditional Interment

Across most of the United States, in-ground burial (called interment) is considered to be the most traditional disposition of the deceased. Interment requires deceased loved ones to be placed in a casket, which is then lowered into the earth. In California, the state requires grave spaces to be lined with a burial container, which can be made of concrete, steel or other permanent materials. The grave space is usually topped with a monument or a marker that is inscribed with the name, birth date and

death date. Markers and monuments can also include pictures and engravings to personalize each location.

EVCD requires all interments to use a vault provided by EVCD. Absolutely no outside vaults will be allowed.

13. If a single burial plot is occupied, 2 sets of ashes may be placed on top of the burial if they are related as follows: parents, grandparents, siblings, aunt, uncle, spouse or any step relation of parents, siblings, or grandparents (signed Burial Authorization is required). 14. A single burial plot may be used for 6 sets of cremated remains (signed Burial Authorization is required). All burial fees will be incurred for each set of cremated remains. An endowment will be charged per each interment. 15. No more than two (2) cremated remains will be placed in a Niche compartment. The size of the cremation urn must meet Cemetery specifications for one or two interments.
